Intended Spend

September 2018 – September 2019

The Milford Academy will continue to:

- Maintain and be an Active Participant of the Sports Partnership in Clifton Schools
- Engage in sporting activities across the City of Nottingham
- Fund transport to and from sporting events
- Offer high quality sports coaching during and after the school day
- Offer after school activities Monday to Friday which are free to access
- Identify and support Gifted and Talented pupils in sport
- Develop high quality physical space and resources to support Healthy Lifestyles.

Key features of 2018/19 Sports Action Plan

- Grant to be allocated: £19,200
- Total number of FT pupils on role: 320 (Year 1 – 6 from January 2018 Census)

To improve swimming outcomes by the end of Year 6.

Identify poor swimmers and offer free access to swimming at Clifton Leisure Centre for targeted pupils.

Monitor access at Clifton Leisure Centre.
